



RAGNER OMTVEDT

- 1912** Immigrated from Oslo, Norway to the U.S. to compete in the Norge Ski Club Championships, settling in Steamboat Springs, CO.
- 1913, 1914, 1917** Class A National Champion.
- 1913** World record set of 169' at Nationals in Ironwood, MI.
- 1916** World record set of 192' 9" at Steamboat Springs, CO.
- Helped establish Revelstoke, British Columbia, Canada, as the site of the then greatest jumping hill in the world.
- 1922** Won Class B National Champion, and Class A National Champion of the Canadian Ski Association.
- 1924** Member of the U.S. Olympic Ski Team in Chamonix, France. He fell severely injuring a leg that has been partially paralyzed ever since, ending his twelve year jumping career in America. He took to cross-country skiing to keep in condition.
- 1957** Elected into the National Ski Hall of Fame in Ishpeming, MI.
