

BRYAN SANDERS

- Began ski jumping at the age of 5 with the St. Paul Ski Club. He later become the youngest St. Paul Ski Club member on the US National Team to compete in the Winter Olympic games.
- 1989 Won US Junior National Championships in Ely, MN. Named to the national team and competed in World Junior Championships in Hamar, Norway.
- 1990 US Ski Team member; skied in 15 World Cup events and represented US Team at the World Ski Flying Championship in Vikersund, Noray.
- 1991 US Ski Team member; Americup Series overall winner; 1st place Steamboat Springs Winter Carnival; finished 3rd in Iron Mountain, MI in a field of over 40 international competitors. Competed in the World Cup Ski Flying Championships at Planica, Slovenia, with his longest personal jump of 491 feet.
- 1992 US Ski Team member; named to the US Olympic Team. During the Olympic competitions held in Courchevel, France, Sanders was a member of the US squad that placed 12th in team competitions. Individually, he placed 36th and 37th respectively in competitions on the normal and large hills.
- 1993 Fourth and final season on US Ski Team. Recurring knee injuries hastened an early departure from active competition. Following retirement, he continued his participation, being named USSA Central Division Junior Development Coach.
- 1996 Named US Domestic Coach of the Year; coached four Junior Olympic Teams for the Central Division.
