



TIM DENISSON

Tim was introduced to the sport in 1950 at age 2 by his father. He was a member of the St. Paul Ski Club and became an accomplished ski jumper at age 7, qualifying to compete at Mt. Washington in Eau Claire, WI. He developed into a top Central Division junior ski jumper. He has been dedicated to the sport ever since.

1959 At age 11, he was the youngest ski jumper to compete at Battle Creek in St Paul. He later set the hill record in 1968.

1964 Member Junior National Team; received full scholarship to University of Wyoming.

1968-76 Member of US Ski Jumping Team; second in NCAA Championships. Was a three time All-American NCAA Ski Jumper.

1977-present National Masters Chairman. Competes every year at the Masters Championships all around the world, from Russia to Germany, has won both a silver medal and two bronze medals in the World Championships.

1980-88 Assistant National Ski Jumping Coach

2006 Inducted into US Masters Hall of Fame

2007 Inducted into the University of Wyoming Athletic Hall of Fame

2011 Since the mid 70's he has been coaching young athletes in both ski jumping and soccer.
