Mark Levasseur – Athlete, Judge, Sport Builder

Impressions - Athlete

I recall Mark competing at several Brattleboro Outing Club, Salisbury Winter Sports Association, and Lake Placid Ski Jumping events during the mid-1970s. Those events were on the larger hills (k65 and K 90 meter) in the Eastern Division. Mark skied those hills very well at a young age aside considerably older competitors. He earned respect and friendship from those competitors for doing so. Mark clearly had a passion for participating and competing in the sport of Ski Jumping. Despite his difference in age with his competitors during the mid-1970s, it was clear that Mark enjoyed the comradery and mutual respect shared on and off the hills among competitors including himself.

Highlights – Judge

When I began pursuing my training to become a USSA certified Ski Jumping Judge Mark was Co-Chair of Eastern Officials Committee. I consider myself extremely fortunate to have been able to attend the workshops and clinics that Mark organized and conducted annually for Eastern Ski Jumping Officials. Those workshops were packed with information about assessing and judging Ski Jumpers' performances which was presented extremely well. Mark was very generous with his time as well as his extensive and always up-to-date knowledge of FIS/USSA Ski Jumping Rules and judging protocols. As Chair of the Eastern Officials Committee Mark was also a member of the Eastern Ski Jumping and Nordic Combined Committee. At meetings of that Committee Mark continually supported and sought to advance programs that provided training and competition opportunities to athletes all around the Eastern Division regardless of what clubs the athletes might have been members. Mark also supported programs that made opportunities more accessible to more high school and collegiate athletes clearly with his intentions being to retain those athletes as participants in the sport and to grow the population of participants as much as possible.

Highlights - Sport Builder

Mark is one of the original founders of New England Ski Jumping Nordic Combined ("NESJNC"). NESJNC was founded in 2016 to design, implement, manage, and sustain programs that will assist Ski Jumpers and Nordic Combined athletes in New England to move from smaller hills (≤ K38 meters) to larger hills (≥ K48 meters) with the prospect that those athletes might become motivated to pursue regional and national level competitive careers in Ski Jumping and/or Nordic Combined. As a founding member Mark has been an integral contributor to the group's definition of NESJNC's mission, determining its activities, planning and managing how NESJNC's activities are to be implemented and completed, as well as recruiting new members and resources. Mark's experiences as a Ski Jumper (a competitor from an early age to more senior years at local to national levels), an international official, an Eastern Division and USSA Officials Committees leader, and businessperson/entrepreneur have been extremely valuable to generating and sustaining NESJNC's success in a very short period of time.


