



John Lundin

Author, Speaker, Ski Jumping Historian

John W. Lundin is a prolific writer and award-winning author dedicated to preserving the history of ski jumping in America. Born and raised in Seattle, he earned B.A. and J.D. degrees from the University of Washington and a Master of Urban and Regional Planning from George Washington University, practicing law as both a federal and private trial attorney. His book *Ski Jumping in Washington State: A Nordic Tradition* and his earlier *Skiing Sun Valley: A History from Union Pacific to the Holdings* are both Skade Award winners from the International Skiing History Association. His most recent publication is a history of the Sun Valley Ski Club.

Lundin has brought the history of ski jumping to thousands through exhibits at the National Nordic Museum and the Sun Valley Museum, a TV show on ski jumping in Sun Valley, and a regular magazine history column. In 2023, the Far West Ski Association honored him with the Western Ski Heritage Prize for his devoted efforts.

Most recently, John has worked tirelessly as a NASJA board member to secure endorsements for the inclusion of women in Nordic Combined at the 2030 Olympic Winter Games. He is now working internationally to link U.S. ski jumping history with Norway's Holmenkollen Ski Museum. John Lundin's induction honors contributions that will echo through the sport for generations.
